SCHOOL SAFETY TIPS POSTING PICTURES ONLINE

As we embark on a new school year, it's crucial to prioritize the safety of our precious ones. Here are four invaluable tips to keep in mind when capturing those cherished back-to-school moments:



- 1. Guard Their School Identity: Avoid sharing your child's school name publicly. In the digital age, a quick online search can reveal their location. If you must share, ensure your privacy settings are on point to limit visibility to friends and family only.
- 2. Protect Teacher Information: Refrain from disclosing your child's teacher's name. With school directories often including staff details, let's avoid making our children easily traceable. Limit the details you reveal about your child's school in public posts.
- 3. Keep Their Favorite Things Private: Keep your child's favorites offline. Someone could exploit these details to gain their trust. Let's safeguard our young ones from potential threats.
- 4. Blur Logos and Identifiers: Check your surroundings before snapping. Ensure logos and location markers are blurred or hidden, a simple step to shield their exact whereabouts.

OTIPEMISIWAK MÉTIS GOVERNMENT BENEVOLENCE FUND

You're never ready to lose a loved one. We understand the toll losing someone can take and we would like to help. Our Benevolence Fund was created for this situation, to offer some financial relief to our Citizens suffering a loss in their family.

If you are an immediate family member who is responsible for paying for the funeral and it has been no longer than 4 months since the day of passing, you could receive a onetime payout of \$500 to help cover funeral costs associated with losing a loved one.



After the amazing success of our Métis Community Garden last year, we are thrilled to announce that it is now prime garden season! We are looking for volunteers to help us at the Community Garden!






