

Many Canadians know the inspiring story of Terry Fox and his Marathon of Hope, but did you know that this Canadian hero is Métis? ∞

Darrell Fox, Terry's younger brother, proudly shares that their family only discovered their Métis heritage after the passing of their grandmother, Mary Ann Gladue, in 2001. Since then, they have been rediscovering and embracing their Métis roots, gaining a deeper understanding of their family legacy.



Genealogical research revealed that their ancestors were bison hunters from the Red River communities of St. Norbert and St. Francis Xavier in Manitoba. 🐃 Their family fled to the United States during the Red River Resistance in 1869-70, but their Métis spirit remains strong.

Every year, we celebrate Terry Fox Day to honor his remarkable Marathon of Hope, where ran over 3,000 miles despite losing a leg to cancer. His goal was to fund cancer research and find a cure. Terry's legacy continues to inspire us all, reminding us of the power of dedication, hope, and community. 4

🔾 🎬 Synopsis of Indian Horse:


"..In the late 1950's Ontario, eight-year-old Saul Indian Horse is torn from his Ojibway family and committed to one of the notorious Catholic Residential Schools. In this oppressive environment, Saul is denied the freedom to speak his language or embrace his Indigenous heritage while he

witnesses horrendous abuse at the hands of the very people entrusted with his care. Despite this, Saul finds salvation in the unlikeliest of places and favourite winter pastime -- hockey. Fascinated by the game, he secretly teaches himself to play, developing a unique and rare skill. He seems to see the game in a way no other player can."

Walter has been with Métis District 21 for six incredible years, and his dedication and hard work have not gone unnoticed. Recently, at the Inaugural Citizens' Gathering, Walter was honored by Otipemisiwak Métis Government President Andrea Sandmaier 🐇 for his outstanding contributions to the Self-Government Transition Committee. His efforts, along with Knowledge Keeper Jamie Chalifoux, are making a significant impact as we move forward in our journey toward self-governance.

Beyond his work with us, Walter is a key figure in the Indigenous Advisory Committee (IAC) of the Otipemisiwak Métis Nation of Alberta, where he ensures that our Indigenous voices and perspectives are heard and respected. His work in the Consultation Process for Lesser Slave Lake Métis Territory and on the Credible Assertion Report that is currently under review by the Province of Alberta highlights his commitment to protecting our Métis District 21 traditional lands, plants, and animals.

Walter's dedication to our community doesn't stop there. He has been actively installing wildlife cameras to monitor the presence of Caribou in our Métis District 21 and District 22 and is a proud member of the National Boreal Caribou Knowledge Consortium (NBCKC). In fact, he even represented our region in a live panel discussion at the United Nations Biodiversity Conference in Montreal in 2022!

Walter is not just a passionate protector of our lands—he's also a loving father, a fun-filled friend, and an active member of Slave Lake Local #19 Métis. He's always ready to bring joy to our community, whether it's through his work or by playing the big jolly man in red at our Christmas parties.

In 2023, Walter was appointed to the Circle of Experts with the Government of Canada, contributing to developing Indigenous Cooperation Agreement Regulations and Policy. His work continues to open important conversations and pave the way for Indigenous rightsholders across Turtle Island (the traditional homelands of our nations).






