Everyone is welcome — Elders, parents, kids, cousins, friends — the more, the merrier!


Don't forget your towel, swimsuit, sunscreen, and something comfy to sit on! We can't wait to see you there!

METIS EMERGENCY INFORMATION FOR WILDFIRE SEASON

Spring and Summer 202

From March 1 to October 31, Northern Alberta is in wildfire season.

If you are a Lesser Slave Lake Métis District citizen with a valid MNA citizenship card and have been evacuated or are at risk due to wildfires, we are here to support you.

Let's stay safe and connected. Reach out if you or your family need support, contact us directly, and we can point you to the proper supports available — we stand together, always.







BENEVOLENCE FUND

Ongoing Program by the OMG



Have you recently lost an immediate family member and are struggling with funeral expenses?

The Benevolence Fund is here to help eligible Citizens of the Otipemisiwak Métis Government / Métis Nation of Alberta during difficult times.

Who Can Apply?

- You, or the deceased, must be a Citizen of the Otipemisiwak Métis Government/Métis Nation of Alberta.
- You must be an immediate family member of the deceased (spouse, parent, grandparent, child, grandchild, or sibling), or identified as next of kin.
- You are responsible for funeral costs and facing financial hardship.
 Important Details:
- Applications must be submitted within 4 months of the passing.
- Payment goes directly to the applicant (not to the estate or funeral home).
- Only one application per deceased family member will be approved.
- Processing takes approximately six weeks after all documents are received.


Celebrating The Hardworking and Humble Matt!

Matt left home at just 16 and carved out a life for himself in Slave Lake, finishing high school at Lakeside Outreach while working to support his goals.

Since 2017, he's built an incredible career at Alberta Plywood, earning his Red Seal Millwright and now serving as Maintenance Chargehand — a role that speaks to his leadership and dedication.



Matt comes from a strong Métis lineage: his Kokum helped preserve the Michif language, and his Moshum played a role in founding the MMF in Manitoba. Their legacy lives on through him — and now through his two beautiful daughters, who he raises with love and pride. In recent years, Matt has dedicated a summer week to chaperoning the Lesser Slave Lake Metis District Youth Culture Camp and volunteers his time at other Metis events.

This week, they gifted a handcrafted quilt to our own Métis Citizen, Christine Proulx — a gesture of warmth, healing, and deep respect.






